Biographical Sketch / Administrative History Robert Murray Pringle was born on April 25, 1946 in Regina, Saskatchewan to Douglas Duncombe and Norma Pringle. He was raised on a farm in the Carnduff area. Pringle holds Bachelor and Masters degrees in Social Work from the University of Manitoba.

Prior to his entry into provincial politics, Pringle worked as a social worker and administrator in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. Pringle worked with the Department of Social Services and was executive director of the Saskatoon Housing Coalition. He also served as president of the Saskatchewan Association of Social Workers (1980) and Saskatchewan Human Services Association (1986). Pringle was active in the Saskatoon community, serving on the boards of the Saskatoon Self-Help Society, Crocus Co-op, Girls Group Home and Day Care Co-op.

Pringle was first elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature in a 1988 by-election and served as a New Democratic Party member for Saskatoon Eastview (1988-1991; 1995-1998) and Saskatoon Eastview-Haultain (1991-1995).

Pringle served in the Roy Romanow Government as Minister of Social Services (1993-1995); Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Legal Aid Commission (1993-1995); Minister Responsible for Seniors (1993-1995); Minister Responsible for Meewasin Valley Authority (1995); and Minister Responsible for Wanuskewin Heritage Park Corporation (1995).

Pringle resigned from Cabinet on November 22, 1995 and vacated his seat in the Legislative Assembly on March 17, 1998. Judy Junor (NDP) became MLA for Saskatoon Eastview.

After leaving politics, Pringle served as executive director of the Saskatchewan Association for Community Living from 1998 to 2004, when he became executive director of the Saskatoon Food Bank.

Pringle currently (2006) continues to reside in Saskatoon and to serve as executive director of the Saskatoon Food Bank. He is running as a candidate in the 2006 Saskatoon Civic Election.

Pringle married Gwendolyn Mae Gordon on October 12, 1968. They have two children: Darren and Dean.

Patricia Atkinson was born on September 27, 1952 in Biggar, Saskatchewan to Robert Roy and Betty Atkinson. She attended Walter Murray Collegiate in Saskatoon and earned Bachelor of Arts (Honours) and Education degrees from the University of Saskatchewan. Atkinson worked as a teacher, union organizer and principal until 1986, when she was first elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature. She served as the New Democratic Party MLA for Saskatoon Nutana (1986-1991, 1995 -) and Saskatoon Broadway (1991-1995) constituencies.

Atkinson served in the Roy Romanow Government as Minister of Social Services (1992-1993); Minister Responsible for Seniors (1992-1993); Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Legal Aid Commission (1992-1993); Minister of Education, Training and Employment (1993-1995); Minister Responsible for New Careers Corporation (1992-1995); Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Communications Network Corporation (1993-1995); Minister Responsible for Teachers Superannuation Commission (1993-1998); Minister of Education (1995-1998); Minister of Health (1998-2001); Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Health Information Network (1998-1999); Minister Responsible for Health Services Utilization and Research Commission (1998-2001); and Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Cancer Foundation (1998-2001).

Atkinson served in the Lorne Calvert Government as Minister of Highways and Transportation (2001); Minister Responsible for Rural Revitalization (2001); and Deputy Government House Leader (2001). She left Cabinet in October 2001 and returned in 2003, when she was appointed Minister of Crown Management Board (2003-2006); Minister Responsible for the Public Service Commission; and Minister Responsible for Immigration.

Atkinson currently (2007) serves in the Calvert Government as Minister of Advanced Education and Employment; Minister Responsible for Immigration; and Minister Responsible for the Public Service Commission. She continues to serve as MLA for Saskatoon Nutana.

Pat Atkinson married Kenneth Kutz on December 26, 1981.

Janice MacKinnon was born on January 30, 1947 in Kitchener, Ontario to William and Melinda Potter. She earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Western Ontario and a Master of Arts degree and doctorate from Queen's University.

Prior to entering provincial politics, MacKinnon was a professor in the History Department of the University of Saskatchewan. She was President of the Saskatoon Co-operative Association and from 1988 to 1990 she was Vice-President of the Saskatchewan New Democratic Party and a political commentator for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC).

MacKinnon was first elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature in 1991 and served as the New Democratic Party MLA for the Saskatoon Westmount (1991-1995) and Saskatoon Idylwyld (1995-2001) constituencies.

MacKinnon served in the Roy Romanow and Lorne Calvert Governments as Minister of Social Services (1991-1992); Associate Minister of Finance (1992-1993); Minister of Finance (1993-1997); Minister of Economic and Co-operative Development (1997-2001) and Government House Leader (1997-1999).

MacKinnon was Minister Responsible for Crown Investments Corporation (1992-1993, 2001); Seniors (1991-1992); New Careers Corporation (1991-1992); Meewasin Valley Authority (1991-1993); Wanuskewin Heritage Park Corporation (1991-1993); CIC Mineral Interests Corporation (1992-1993); Saskatchewan Gaming Commission (1992-1993); Saskatchewan Pension Plan (1992-1997); NewGrade Energy (1992-1993); Municipal Financing Corporation (1993-1997); Saskatchewan Development Fund Corporation (1993-1997); Saskatchewan Opportunities Corporation (1997-2001); Saskatchewan Government Growth Fund Management Corporation (1997-2001); Tourism Authority (1997-2001); Information Highway (1998-2001); SaskEnergy Inc. (2001); Saskatchewan Power Corporation (2001); Saskatchewan Telecommunications (2001); Saskatchewan Telecommunications Holding Corporation (2001); Saskatchewan Government Insurance (2001); and Saskatchewan Transportation Company (2001).

MacKinnon resigned from Cabinet on March 2, 2001 and vacated

her seat in the Saskatchewan Legislature on September 30, 2001. David Forbes (NDP) became the MLA for Saskatoon Idylwyld in the November 8, 2001 by-election.

MacKinnon returned to teaching at the University of Saskatchewan in 2001. In October, 2003, she was appointed to the board of the Institute for Research on Public Policy. MacKinnon has written extensively on public policy and is the author of books on women refugees and political culture, including *Minding the Public Purse: The Fiscal Crisis, Political Trade-offs and Canada's Future*.

MacKinnon currently (2006) continues to teach at the U of S.

Janice Potter married R. Peter MacKinnon, a lawyer, on April 20, 1974. They have two children: Alan Douglas and William Taylor.

Scope and Content	<p>This fonds consists of records created, accumulated and used from 1993 to 1995 by Bob Pringle in his political career as Minister of Social Services; MLA for Saskatoon Eastview-Haultain and Saskatoon Eastview; member of the Saskatchewan New</p>

Democratic Party (NDP); and member of the Saskatchewan NDP Caucus.

The fonds contains public and political records.

This fonds consists of five series: Minister of Social Services; Events/Appointments/Meetings; Speeches; MLA/Constituency; and Political.

The Minister of Social Services series has been arranged into twenty-one sub-series: Social Services; Adoption Services; Appeal Boards/Committees; Child Care/Children; Family Services; Child Protection; Young Offenders/Facilities; Legal Aid; Saskatchewan Assistance Plan; Human Services Organizations; Group/Special Care Homes-Independent/Community Living; Legislative Assembly; Casework – 1993; Chronological Correspondence – 1993; Provincial Government Departments – 1993; Other Provinces – 1993; Casework – 1994; Chronological Correspondence – 1994; Provincial Government Departments – 1994; Other Provinces – 1994; and Provincial Government Departments – 1995.

The Events/Appointments/Meetings series consists of three sub-series: 1993; 1994; and 1995. Pringle attended political, party, portfolio and Legislative Assembly events and meetings.

No sub-series have been assigned to the Speeches, MLA/Constituency and Political series.

The Speeches series consists of speeches accumulated by Pringle while in the Social Services portfolio. These include speeches given by Janice MacKinnon, Patricia Atkinson, Premier Roy Romanow and other NDP MLA's.

The records in the MLA/constituency series and Political series were separated out from the Minister of Social Services series by the archivist and described as distinct series.

The types of records included are correspondence, memoranda, legislation, newspaper clippings, news releases, reports, publications, photographs and an audio cassette.

The fonds includes records created by Janice MacKinnon and Pat Atkinson as Minister of Social Services.

The fonds is missing MLA/constituency material and records Pringle created as Minister Responsible for Seniors; Minister Responsible for Meewasin Valley Authority and Minister Responsible for Wanuskewin Heritage Park Corporation.
