Biographical Sketch / Administrative History Charles Beverley Koester was born on January 13, 1926 in Regina, Saskatchewan to Charles H. and Mavis Koester. He had one sibling: Vera-May (Mimi). Koester received his primary and secondary education at Davin School and Regina Central Collegiate Institute and graduated from the Royal Canadian Naval College, Royal Roads, in Victoria, British Columbia in 1944. Koester earned Bachelor of Education (1952), Bachelor of Arts (1953) and Master of Arts in History (1964) degrees from the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon. He earned a Doctor of Philosophy degree in Western Canadian History from the University of Alberta in Edmonton in 1971.

From 1953 to 1975, Koester held a variety of occupations: staff officer with the University Naval Training Division in Saskatoon (1953-1956); teacher and head of the History department at Sheldon-Williams Collegiate in Regina (1956-1959); Clerk Assistant of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan (1959-1960); Clerk of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan (1960-1969); and associate professor of History at the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus (1969-1975).

During his career in Saskatchewan, Koester also served as Temporary Senior Clerk of the British House of Commons in London, England (1967, 1969); Commissioner to the Federal Electoral Boundaries Commission of the Province of Saskatchewan (1965); member of the General University Council Committee on the Role of the University of Saskatchewan within the Community (1970-1971); member of the Woods Committee; historical researcher for the Commissioner on Indian Claims (1973); and consultant to Department of Indian and Northern Affairs (1974-1975).

Koester moved to Ottawa, Ontario in 1975 and served as Clerk Assistant of the House of Commons (1975-1979) and Clerk of the House of Commons (1979-1987). He retired in 1987 and was named Clerk Emeritus of the House of Commons. Koester retired to Kingston, Ontario, where he died on February 1, 1998.

Koester served with the Royal Canadian Navy (1942-1947) and Royal Canadian Naval Reserve (1949-1960). He saw active duty in Scotland during World War II and retired as a Lieutenant-Commander in 1960. Koester was awarded the Canadian Forces

Decoration in 1959.

Koester wrote and edited numerous articles, books and unpublished research papers on parliamentary and aboriginal issues and on Western Canadian history. He was a member of many organizations and professional societies, including the Canadian Historical Association and Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (secretary of Saskatchewan Branch, 1960-1969). The recipient of many scholarships and awards, Koester was made an Officer of the Order of Canada in 1989 for his public service.

Koester married Carolyn Eleanor Williams in 1951. They had five children: Elizabeth, Charles, Christopher, James, and Kate. Carolyn Koester died in Kingston, Ontario on May 7, 2002.

Koester moved to Ottawa, Ontario in 1975 and served in the House of Commons as Clerk Assistant and Clerk. He retired in 1987 and died in Kingston, Ontario in 1998. Charles Beverley (Bev) Koester was born in Regina on 13th January 1926, and lived there until 1942 when he entered the naval college Royal Roads in Victoria, B.C. He returned to Saskatchewan to further his studies in education and history, graduating with a Master of Arts from the University of Saskatchewan in 1964. In 1971 he received a Ph.D. in history from the University of Alberta.

Mr. Koester was head of the history department at Sheldon-Williams Collegiate in Regina from 1956-1959. He then accepted a position as assistant clerk of the Legislative Assembly of Saskatchewan and was appointed clerk in 1960, a position he held until 1969. He resigned to become associate professor of history at the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus. He left Regina in 1975 when he became clerk assistant of the House of Commons in Ottawa. In 1979 he was named clerk of the House of Commons, and Clerk Emeritus of the House of Commons in 1987.

Many scholarships and awards have been bestowed upon him including Officer of the Order of Canada on April 20, 1989. He held memberships in a number of professional societies, and published numerous articles and books. He and his wife, Carolyn, had five children. Beverley Koester retired to Kingston, Ontario where he died on 1st February 1998.

This collection includes materials relating to the committee on the role of the University of Saskatchewan within the community; the Electoral Boundaries Commission for Saskatchewan; Woods Committee materials relating to the Legislative Assembly Superannuation Act; and correspondence and memoranda concerning Nicholas Flood Davin and Agnes Agatha Robinson.

This collection also consists of ten volumes of C.B. Koester's professional and personal diaries entitled "From My Place At The Table" (1959-1987).

These records were received from Dr. Koester on September 2, 1965, August 14, 1975 and June 9, 1987, and assigned Accession Nos. 392, 643 and R87-267 respectively.
