Hazel Ludema Corneil was born on November 12, 1912 in the Hope, Saskatchewan district to Sherman and Ethel Campbell. She was educated in the Oxbow district and completed teacher training in Regina. She began teaching in the 1930s and worked at various jobs until her marriage to Robert Corneil, a farmer, on June 21, 1944. The Corneils resided on a farm in the Oxbow district until 1973, when they retired and moved into Oxbow. Hazel Corneil was a charter member of the South Oxbow Ladies' Club and a member of the Oxbow-Glen Ewen History Book Committee. Corneil resided in Estevan later in her life. She died in Gainsborough on July 18, 2002 and was buried in Oxbow

Cemetery. The Corneils did not have any children.

The records relate to various subjects, including events, people, businesses, buildings, animals, schools, churches and sports teams.

The types of records included are newspaper clippings, photographs, a map, scrapbooks, hand-written notes, family histories, publications, articles, reminiscences, programmes and brochures.

She received her education in the Oxbow area and in Regina, and taught school for a number of years. In 1944, she married Robert Corneil who farmed in the area. Both were active in the community serving on various boards and committees. For a complete biography, see Oxbow's local history entitled Furrow to the Future: Oxbow-Glen Ewen, volume 1, located in the R-E section of the Saskatchewan Archives.
