Brief Bio./Admin. History

Isidore Charles Nollet was born in 1898 in North Dakota. In 1921, he settled in Saskatchewan, where he ranched and was involved with various political and co-operative organizations. Nollet served as a Co-operative Commonwealth Federation (CCF) member for Cut Knife in the Saskatchewan Legislature (1944-1967); as Deputy Speaker of the Saskatchewan Legislative Assembly (1944-1946); and as Minister of Agriculture (1946-1964). Nollet retired from political life in 1967 and remained in Regina. He died in Kelowna, British Columbia in 1988.

Biographical Sketch/Administrative History Isidore Charles Nollet was born on November 18, 1898 at Sentinel Butte, North Dakota. He attended St. Benedict's Academy and St. Thomas Military College in Minnesota. During World War I, Nollet served overseas with the American Expeditionary Force as a non-commissioned officer. After the War, he went with his father to British Columbia before moving in 1921 to Freemont, Saskatchewan, where he established a ranching operation stocked with Aberdeen Angus cattle. In 1957, the ranch was sold to a group of neighbours who formed the Neilburg Co-operative Grazing Association.

Nollet served as reeve of the Rural Municipality of Hillsdale No. 440 for three terms and was an active member of the United Farmers of Canada. He was also a member of various cooperatives, including the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool. Nollet held membership in the Royal Canadian Legion and was inducted into the Saskatchewan Agricultural Hall of Fame in 1975.

Nollet's political career began in 1941, when he ran unsuccessfully as a candidate for The Battlefords riding in the federal election. In 1944, he was elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature as a Co-operative Commonwealth Federation (CCF) member for Cut Knife and remained in his seat until 1967. Nollet served as Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly (1944-1946) and as Minister of Agriculture (1946-1964). After retiring from political life in 1967, Nollet remained in Regina. He died in Kelowna, British Columbia on April 29, 1988.

Nollet married Patricia (Peggy) Chicilo of Glenwood City, Wisconsin on April 21, 1933. The Nollets had two children: Toby James and Thomas Gerald. Variant Name(s) "Toby" Nollet

#### **Scope and Content**

This fonds consists mainly of records created, accumulated and used by Isidore Charles Nollet during his political career as Minister of Agriculture. The types of records included are correspondence; memoranda; reports and publications; speeches; newspaper clippings; and copies of orders-in-council.

No series assignment has been applied to the records in this fonds. The headings assigned to the records in collection R-1310 are as follows: Department of Agriculture Files; Agencies Responsible to the Minister of Agriculture; Other Government Agencies; and Conferences, Speeches, Politics and Miscellaneous.

This fonds is missing records Nollet created as Deputy Speaker of the Legislature Assembly and Member of the Legislative Assembly for Cut Knife.

The fonds includes a small volume of Nollet's personal records, relating mainly to the St. Benedict's Boys' School reunion in 1962 and an address given by Nollet at the memorial service for Max Campbell.

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#### Introduction

Isidore Charles Nollet was born in North Dakota 18 November 1898 and educated at St. Thomas College, St. Paul, Minnesota. He served with the American Expeditionary Force Overseas during World War I. After the war, he settled near Freemont, Saskatchewan and engaged in farming and ranching. He was a member of the Canadian Legion, the United Farmers of Canada (Saskatchewan Section) and other co-operative associations, and he served three terms as Reeve of RM 440.

I.C. Nollet was first elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature in the general election of 1944 as the CCF member for Cutknife constituency. He was appointed Minister of Agriculture on 8 January 1946 and served in that capacity until his party's defeat in the election of 1964. Nollet, himself easily held his seat in that election. He sat as an opposition MLA until the 1967 election in which he did not run.

The papers listed herein were donated to the Saskatchewan Archives Board on 13 December 1984 and assigned Accession No. R84-487. They cover the entire period of Nollet's political career, but particularly the period 1956-1964.

The numbers given in brackets in the file titles are the file numbers used by the Minister's office. When requesting material, researchers should ignore these numbers and cite only the file numbers assigned by the Archives.
