Saskatchewan. In 1936, she married Ernest Hande. She resided on a farm in the Marchwell district with her husband and family until 1947, when they moved into Marchwell. A homemaker, Isabel Hande was active in church and community organizations. She

died in 1989.

Biographical Sketch Vera Isabel Bennett was born in 1914 on a farm near Marchwell,

Saskatchewan to Robert and Mary (Trotter) Bennett. In 1936, she married Ernest Hande, with whom she had five sons. Isabel and Ernest Hande farmed in the Marchwell district until 1947, then moved into Marchwell, where Ernest operated a general store. Isabel Hande was active in church and community organizations, including the Bethel Lutheran Church, Marchwell Community Ladies' Auxiliary, the local Co-operative Commonwealth Federation/New Democratic Part (CCF/NDP) constituency

association, the local school board, the Canadian Red Cross and the Canadian Cancer Society. Isabel Hande died in Langenburg,

Saskatchewan in 1989.
