Brief Bio./Admin. History	Otto William Herbster was born in Germany in 1898. He immigrated to Canada in 1927 and settled in the Whitewood, Saskatchewan district, where he operated a well digging business and pig farm. Herbster and his second wife, Sophie Mueller, resided on the farm until 1979, when they retired to Whitewood. Otto Herbster died in 1986.
Biographical Sketch/Administrative History	Otto William Herbster was born on February 27, 1898 in Stetten, West Germany to Rudolph and Emma (Ging) Herbster. After completing high school, he trained as a blacksmith and machinist in Germany. In 1921, Herbster married Anne Hauser. They had three children: Kurt; Annaliese and Elfrida. In October 1927, Herbster immigrated with his wife and son to Canada, where they settled on a farm in the Baynes, Saskatchewan district. Several years later, the family moved from the farm to seven acres of land near Whitewood.
	In 1933, Herbster started a well digging business and dug hundreds of wells in and around Whitewood. After Anne Herbster's death in 1938, Herbster married his second wife, Sophie Mueller, on November 2, 1940, in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Otto and Sophie Herbster established a pig farming operation on their farm, Hurricane Hill Top Farm, where they resided until 1979, when they sold their farm and moved into Whitewood. Otto Herbster died in Whitewood on May 16, 1986.

Biographical Sketch/Administrative History	Sophie Louise Mueller was born on April 25, 1901 in Illingen, West Germany to Karl and Sophie (Boger) Muelller. In July 1915, she immigrated with her mother to Missouri, United States of America, where she studied English and worked as a housekeeper/nanny. She then returned to Germany briefly before moving to New York City. She married Otto Herbster on November 2, 1940 in Winnipeg, Manitoba. Sophie and Otto Herbster resided on a farm near Whitewood, Saskatchewan. Sophie assisted her husband with his well digging and farming operations. The Herbsters retired from farming in 1979 and moved into Whitewood. Sophie Herbster died on July 10, 1991. She had three step-children: Kurt; Annaliese and Elfrida.

A native of Lorrach, Germany, Otto Herbster came to Canada about 1927 and settled near Whitewood, Saskatchewan, where he began farming. He had a son and two daughters with his first wife.

In 1940, Otto married Sophie Müller who had arrived in the United States from Germany in 1914. They shared an interest in politics and world affairs, and became involved in the CCF Party in Saskatchewan. Otto retired from farming at 80 years of age. He died in 1986.

This collection includes correspondence with family and friends, diaries, news clippings, guest books, note books and correspondence relating to well digging, records concerning their farming operation, and German language books and pamphlets. The files are arranged alphabetically by subject.

The materials covered by this checklist were received on September 4, 1992 from the Estate of Sophie Herbster per Pemrose Whelan, and assigned Accession No. R92-231.
