Provincial councils were deemed necessary since the provincial government has jurisdiction over education, health and welfare.

	clippings; constitution and bylaws; copies of reports to the National Council Of Women (1956-1982); correspondence; correspondence, reports, printed material of Chairman Of Citizenship And International Affairs, 1967-1977; files of provincial presidents and corresponding secretaries; financial records and statements; lists of members and officers; minutes; newsletters; newspaper scrapbooks of the Regina Council Of Women; papers of Miss Bates; papers of Mrs. Johnson; printed material; programmes; Provincial Council history, 1919-1984; publications; records for the Everywomen's Fund, a successful project which raised \$50,000 between 1922-1928 for tuberculosis sanatoria; regulations re life memberships; reports; resolutions; rosters; scrap books (including scrapbooks of entries to poster contest); subject files; year books of the National Council Of Women.

The Council's accomplishments include helping to secure the franchise for Saskatchewan women in 1920.

The following collection includes annual reports, briefs, constitutions and by-laws, correspondence received and sent by the President, minutes, newsletters, and newspaper clippings. Miscellaneous subject files and records relating to the National Council of Women of Canada and the Regina, Saskatoon, Moose Jaw and Swift Current Local Councils are included.
