Brief Bio./Admin. History Woodrow Stanley Lloyd was born in Webb, Saskatchewan, in 1913. Prior to entering politics, he was a teacher and principal and served as president of the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation. Lloyd served as a Co-operative Commonwealth Federation member in the Saskatchewan Legislature for the Biggar constituency (1944-1967), as the New Democratic Party member for the Biggar constituency (1967-1971) and as a Cabinet minister in the T.C. Douglas Government (1944-1961). Lloyd served as Premier of Saskatchewan from 1961 to 1964. Woodrow Lloyd died in Seoul, South Korea, on April 7, 1972.

Biographical Sketch/Administrative History

Woodrow Stanley Lloyd was born on July 16, 1913 in Webb, Saskatchewan to Allen Edward and Myrtle Belle (Davis) Lloyd. He received his early education at Lloyd S.D. #1016, in Webb, and in Regina where he graduated from Scott Collegiate. He completed Normal School in Moose Jaw in 1931 and received a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Saskatchewan in 1940. Lloyd completed additional university courses to obtain a high school teaching certificate in 1941.

Prior to his entry into politics, Lloyd taught at Swan Lake S.D. #2374 near Rush Lake (1932) and was principal of schools at Stewart Valley (1934-1936); Vanguard (1936-1941); and Biggar (1941-1944). He served as president of the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation (1940-1944); as an executive member for the Canadian Teachers' Federation (1940); and as president of the Saskatchewan Educational Conference (1942-1944). He was elected to the Senate of the University of Saskatchewan in 1942.

Lloyd was first elected to the Saskatchewan Legislature in 1944 and served as the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation (CCF) Member of the Legislative Assembly (MLA) for the Biggar constituency until 1967. He served as the New Democratic Party (NDP) MLA for the Biggar constituency from 1967 until 1971.

Lloyd served in the T.C. Douglas Government as Minister of Education (1944-August 1960). During this time, he was also Minister in Charge of Libraries (1948-1960); Minister in Charge of Saskatchewan Archives Board (1948-1960); Chairman of Saskatchewan Research Council (1947-1960); Minister in Charge of Public Service Commission (1952-1961); and Chairman of the

Board of the Centre for Community Studies (1957-1960). From August 1960 until November 1961, Lloyd served as Provincial Treasurer; Minister in Charge of Highway Traffic Board; Minister in Charge of Taxation Branch; Minister in Charge of Queen's Printer and Saskatchewan Government Printing Office; Minister in Charge of Saskatchewan Government Purchasing Agency; and Minister in Charge of Government Finance Office.

On November 3, 1961, Lloyd was elected leader of the provincial CCF party and was appointed Premier of Saskatchewan on November 7, 1961. He served as Premier and President of the Executive Council until his Government was defeated in the 1964 general election by the Liberal party. Lloyd continued as leader of the CCF and later NDP parties and served as Leader of the Opposition until his resignation on July 6, 1970. He remained as an MLA until an election was called in 1971.

In February 1972, Lloyd moved to Seoul, South Korea, and began work as a resident representative for the United Nations Development Program. He died in Seoul on April 7, 1972.

Woodrow Lloyd married Victoria Leinan on July 2, 1936. They had four children: Maureen, Dianne, Michael and Evan.

Brief Bio./Admin. History Thomas Kunito Shoyama was born in Kamloops, British Columbia, in 1916. He earned Bachelor of Arts and Commerce degrees from the University of British Columbia in 1938. Shoyama moved to Regina, Saskatchewan, in 1946 and was employed with the Government of Saskatchewan as a research economist, secretary of the Economic Advisory and Planning Board, and as economic advisor to premiers T.C. Douglas and W.S. Lloyd. Thomas Shoyama died in Victoria, British Columbia, in 2006.

Biographical Sketch/Administrative History Thomas Kunito (Tommy) Shoyama was born on September 24, 1916, in Kamloops, British Columbia. He earned Bachelor of Arts in Economics and Bachelor of Commerce degrees from the University of British Columbia in 1938. From 1939 to 1945, Shoyama served as editor of the *New Canadian*, a civil rights newspaper for Japanese-Canadians. In 1946, he worked briefly as a journalist for the Intelligence Corps of the Canadian Army before he moved to Regina, Saskatchewan, to work for the Government of Saskatchewan.

During his tenure with the Government of Saskatchewan, Shoyama was first hired as a research economist. In 1950, he was appointed as secretary to the Economic Advisory and Planning Board. He also served as economic advisor to Premier T.C. Douglas (1950-1961) and Premier W.S. Lloyd (1961-1964).

In 1964, Shoyama moved to Ottawa and became a senior research economist with the Economic Council of Canada. Within the federal government, his appointments included: Assistant Deputy Minister of Finance (1968), Assistant Deputy Minister of Energy, Mines and Resources (1974), and Deputy Minister of Finance (1975). He retired from the federal civil service in 1979 and soon after was appointed as advisor to the Privy Council on economic aspects of the Constitution. In 1980, he became a visiting professor at the University of Victoria in its School of Public Administration and its Centre for Pacific and Oriental Studies.

Awards and honours received by Shoyama included: Officer of the Order of Canada (1978); the Outstanding Achievement Award in the Public Service of Canada (1982); the Vanier Medal from the Institute of Public Administration of Canada (1982); honorary degrees from the University of British Columbia (1984) and University of Victoria (1999); and the Order of the Sacred Treasure from the Government of Japan (1992). The Pearson-Shoyama Institute in Ottawa was partly named in Shoyama's honour. As well, the Johnson-Shoyama Graduate School of Public Policy, established at the University of Regina in 2007, was partly named in Shoyama's honour.

Thomas Shoyama died in Victoria on December 22, 2006.

Scope and Content

This fonds consists of records created, accumulated and used by W.S. Lloyd from 1944 to 1971 during his political career as Minister of Education (1944-1960); Minister in Charge of Libraries and the Saskatchewan Archives Board (1948-1960); Chairman of the Saskatchewan Research Council (1947-1960); Minister in Charge of the Public Service Commission (1952-1961); Minister in Charge of the Board for the Centre for Community Studies (1957-1960); Provincial Treasurer (1960-1961); Minister in Charge of the Highway Traffic Board (1960-1961); Minister in Charge of Taxation Branch (1960-1961); Minister in Charge of Queen's Printer and Saskatchewan Government Printing Office (1960-1961); Minister in Charge of Saskatchewan Government Purchasing Agency (1960-1961); Minister in Charge of Government Finance Office (1960-1961); Premier of Saskatchewan (1961-1964); Leader of the Opposition (1964-1970); and as the Co-operative Commonwealth Federation Member of the Legislative Assembly for Biggar (1944-1967) and the New Democratic Party Member of the Legislative Assembly for Biggar (1967-1971).

This fonds also consists of correspondence written by Lloyd from Bangkok, Thailand to recipients in Saskatchewan in March 1972.

This fonds contains public, political and private records.

Records described in old guide GR 101 were originally arranged into ten collections: Cabinet Secretary Files (R-61.1); Crown Corporations (R-61.2); Personal (Ministerial) Papers - Minister of Education (R-61.3); Premier's Papers (R-61.4); Personal (Ministerial) Papers - Provincial Treasurer (R-61.5); Economic Advisory and Planning Board Files (R-61.6); Miscellaneous Files (R-61.7); Leader of the Opposition Files (R-61.8). Two additional collections were not described in old guide GR 101: Cabinet Documents and Memoranda (R-61.9); and Index Files (R-61.10).

Records created and accumulated by T.K. Shoyama as secretary of the Economic Advisory and Planning Board are included in the fonds.

The types of records included are correspondence; memoranda; briefing notes; itineraries; speeches; minutes and agendas; publications; reports; speaking notes; press releases; newspaper clippings; petitions; legislation; certificates; audio reels; and photographs and negatives.
