**Brief Bio./Admin. History** William Alexander (Bill) Marjerrison was born in Eston, Saskatchewan in 1922. After serving in World War II, he farmed in the Elrose district and served as a municipal official and delegate to the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool. He died in 1991.

**Biographical Sketch/Administrative History** William Alexander Marjerrison was born in Eston, Saskatchewan on February 12, 1922 to Malcolm Gordon and Kathleen Annie Minnie Marjerrison. He had three siblings: Gordon, Jean and Phyllis. Marjerrison was educated in Aird, Wartime, and Regina. He enlisted in the Royal Canadian Air Force in 1942 and served overseas as a flight lieutenant from 1943 to 1945. After the War, Marjerrison returned to the Greenan, Saskatchewan district, near Elrose, where he farmed.

Marjerrison served as a councillor for the Rural Municipality of Fairview No. 258 (1953-1965) and the Rural Municipality of Monet No. 257 (1966-1973). He was a delegate to the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool (1962 to 1985) representing sub-district 2 of District 11. Marjerrison was a charter and executive member of the Saskatchewan Archaeological Society and a member of the Saskatoon Archaeological Society. He held membership in the Elrose Branch of the Royal Canadian Legion; was involved with the United Church; and served on the board of directors of the Elrose Golden Years Lodge.

Marjerrison died in Saskatoon on February 5, 1991. He was buried in the Greenan Cemetery. He did not marry or have children.

The records relate mainly to Marjerrison's activities as a farmer; municipal official; member of the United Church of Canada and delegate to the Saskatchewan Wheat Pool. The fonds also includes records relating to Marjerrison's interest in agriculture, freemasonry, archaeology, and local history.

The types of records included are correspondence; newsletters; permit books; financial records, including farm account books; newspaper clippings; annual reports; publications; local history books; photographs; and maps.

No series assignment has been applied to the records in this fonds. The headings assigned to the records in 1992 are as follows: Agriculture: Miscellaneous; Freemasonry; Geological Surveys and Reports; Grain Handling and Transportation; Land Assessment and Classification; Local Government; Local Histories; Marjerrison Family and Farming Operation; Prairie Regional Studies in Economic Geography; Publications: Miscellaneous; Saskatchewan Wheat Pool; Soil Surveys and Miscellaneous.

## Introduction

William Alexander Marjerrison, son of Malcolm Gordon and Kathleen A.M. Marjerrison, was born in Eston on February 12, 1922. He received his schooling in Aird, Wartime, and Regina, joined the R.C.A.F. in 1941, and served overseas from 1943-1945. He returned home to the family farm near Elrose where he became very active in the community, church affairs, and municipal government serving as councillor for the R.M. of Fairview No. 258, 1953-1965 and the R.M. of Monet No. 257, 1966-1973. In 1978, he received the Public Service Award for his service to the Elrose Golden Years Lodge, 1956-1978. As Saskatchewan Wheat Pool delegate from 1962-1985, he received an Award of Recognition for Plato, Totnes, Wartime and Wiseton. Mr. Marjerrison was a founding member of the Saskatchewan Archaeological Society, held numerous executive positions, including president, and received a Special Merit Award in recognition of outstanding service to the Society and amateur and professional archaeology in Saskatchewan in 1977, as well as a Certificate of Appreciation for support to the Society in 1988. He was also involved in the Royal Canadian Legion, was an active Mason with the Elrose Lodge No. 135 GRS A.F.&A.M., and was involved with the United Church all his life serving on the People's Food Commission relating to food and agriculture.
