DO SOLEMNLY DECLARE:

1. THAT in or about the month of August, A.D., 1902, my Brother Clifton Carss, entered for the South-east Quarter of Section Twenty-four, in Township Twenty (20) in Range Twenty-two West of the Second Meridian, as a Homestead.
2. My said Brother Clifton Carss, died in the month of April, A.D., 1904, and his estate has been administered, my Sister Jennie Balfour, wife of William T. Balfour, of Lumsden, being Administratrix.
3. I have homesteaded the North-West Quarter of Section Twenty-four (24) in Township Twenty (20) in Range Twenty-two (22) West of the Second Meridian, being now entitled to my Patent, having been in continual residence for practically the whole of the past three years, and under instructions from the said Administratrix I undertook to do the homestead duties for the homestead of my said Brother Clifton Carss.
4. During the season of 1904 I broke and backset twelve acres of the said homestead of my said Brother.
5. During the year 1905, I cropped the said twelve acres and cleared up and removed all the stone from an additional fifty acres and struck out the lands for the purpose of breaking the same and am prepared to complete the homestead duties on the said land.

IN THE MATTER OF Homestead Entry covering the south east quarter of Section twenty-four (24) Township twenty (20) Range twenty-two(22) West of the Second Meridian in the Province of Saskatchewan, and the estate of Clifton Carss deceased, and Ellen Stewart, claimants to said homestead.

The petition of the undersigned humbly sheweth:-

That whereas your petitioners are owners of and occupiers of land in the vicinity of the above mentioned homestead:

And whereas your petitioners have personal knowledge of the facts hereinafter set out, namely:-

- I. That during the time the late Clifton Carss held entry for this homestead, he never resided thereon, nor made any improvements thereon in accordance with the Homestead regulations, save and except that during one of the years he held this homestead, he broke and cropped ten acres thereof.
2. That for the past *four* years nothing whatever has been done on said homestead *save as above*.
3. That at the time Ellen Stewart applied for cancellation of said homestead, it was practically impossible for her to know that any ploughing had been done, owing to the proceedings being taken when the snow was on the ground.
4. That the general reputation in the neighborhood as to this homestead was, that there was no breaking or other improvements on same.

And your petitioners further state that in their opinion Ellen Stewart is the proper person to hold this homestead; and owing to improvements which she did on same, namely: partly building a house and stable; your petitioners are of the opinion that a great hardship would be done to her, were she not allowed to hold the entry.

Now therefore for the foregoing reasons, among others which might be adduced, your petitioners humbly pray that your Department will thoroughly investigate this matter, and grant the homestead to Ellen Stewart.




