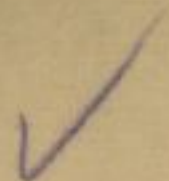

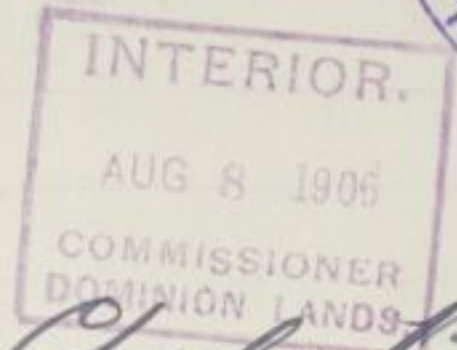

Dear Sir: —

My father Charles Brazer returned from his homestead about a week ago to stay a few days.

Yesterday he met with a very painful accident. A team ran away and broke his left leg above the knee and seriously injuring his right knee.

He is near his eightieth birthday being 80 on the 15<sup>th</sup> Aug next. He has built a frame house 16 stories 12x16 with for four hours fenced about 25 acres and broke about 10 acres since 1<sup>st</sup> day of May last.

This accident will necessitate he being absent from his homestead at least three months and I write this to avoid cancellation proceedings if any should be entered against him.



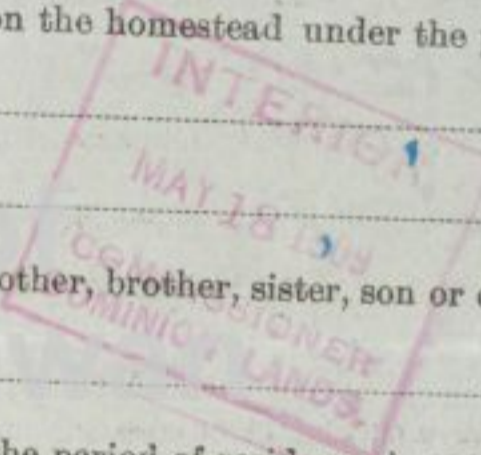
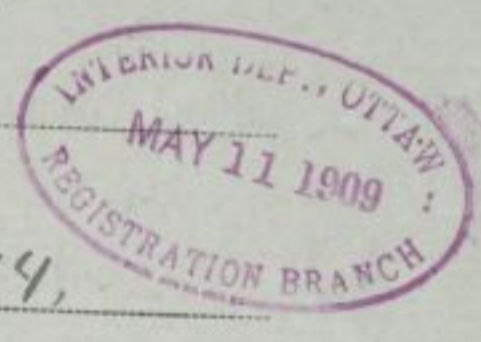
