CERTIFICATE OF NATURALIZATION.

WHEREAS *Henry E. Penner* formerly of
South Dakota, U.S.A. now of *Hague* in the
North-West Territories of the Dominion of Canada, *farmer*
has complied with the several
requirements of "The Naturalization Act", and has duly resided
in Canada for the period of *three* years.

AND WHEREAS the certificate granted to the said
Henry E. Penner
under the tenth section of the said Act has been duly presented
to the said Judge sitting in Chambers in the said Judicial
District; and whereas a copy of such certificate has been duly
posted in a conspicuous place in the Court House in which the
said Judge holds his Chambers, and the said Judge has directed
the issue of a certificate of naturalization to the said

THIS IS THEREFORE to certify to all whom it may concern,
that, under and by virtue of the said Act

Henry E. Penner
has become naturalized as a
British subject, and is within Canada, entitled to all political
and other rights, powers and privileges, and is subject to all
obligations to which a natural born British subject is entitled
or subject within Canada, with this qualification that he shall
not when within the limits of the foreign State of which he was
a subject (or citizen) previous to the date hereof, be deemed
to be a British subject unless he has ceased to be a subject
(or citizen) of that State, in pursuance of the laws thereof,
or in pursuance of a treaty of convention to that effect.
