DECLARATION OF ABANDONMENT.

In the Matter of the S.W. 1/4 of Section 2
Township 35 Range 2 of the 2 Meridian
Homestead Pre-emption

do solemnly declare:—

That I made entry for the above mentioned lands at the Dominion Lands Office at
Yorkton on the — day
of October 1904, and I now ask to have said entry cancelled,
and be permitted to take up another homestead for the following reasons, namely:
