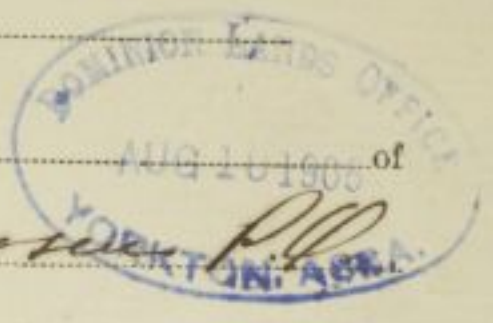
DECLARATION OF ABANDONMENT.

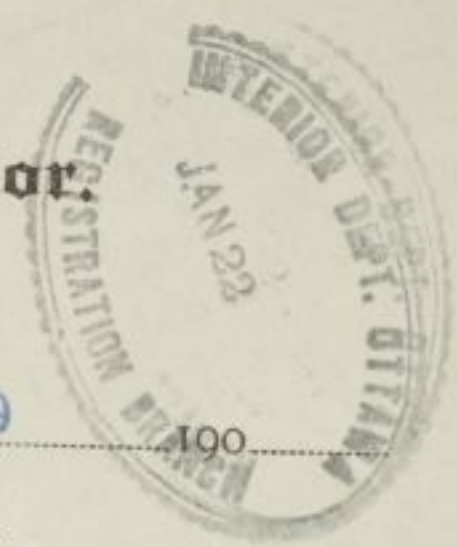
