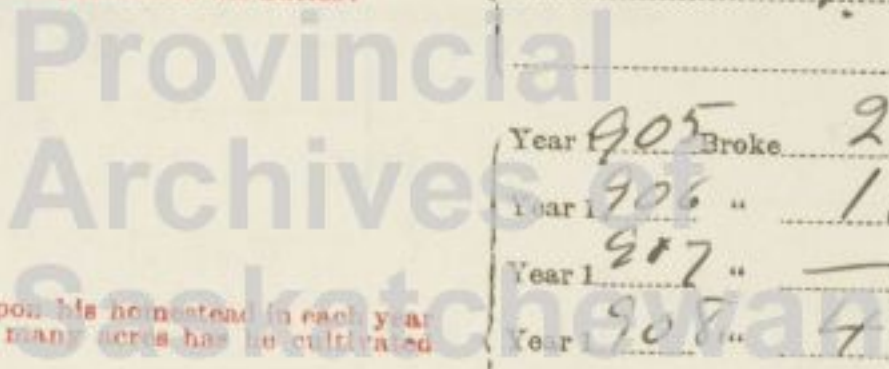

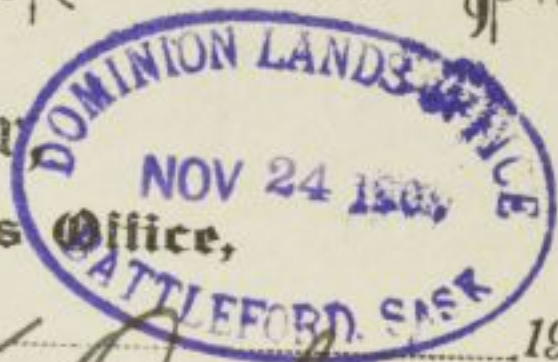

Dear Sir:

The above noted person, an uncle of mine, died intestate in the Winnipeg General Hospital between 1923 and 1925.

It was my understanding that John Osborn who was born on 8 November 1859 at Stoke Goldington, his parents being James Osborn and Mary Osborn, received an original grant of land from the Crown, the land being located in either the Province of Manitoba or Saskatchewan.

I am interested in finding the location of his grave, and it has been suggested to me that should I be able to obtain information regarding the location of the original grant of land, to my uncle, then I might be able to locate his burial place.

I am informed that records are maintained by your Department showing all original grants from the Crown, and I would greatly appreciate any information you can give me which would assist me in locating the grave of my uncle.

In the event there is a charge made for the information such as I have requested, I shall be willing to pay such charges.


Your letter dated the 28th of November, 1956 addressed to the Director of Registration Division, Department of Secretary of State, West Block, Ottawa, has been referred to this Department for attention.

Our records disclose that one John Dill Osborne obtained Letters Patent for the North-west quarter of Section Thirty, Township Seven, Range Seven, West of the Second Meridian, at Forget, Saskatchewan on the 19th of October, 1906. In his sworn statement dated the 26th of June, 1906, in support of his application for Letters Patent for the said land he gave his age as 59 years, and stated that his family consisted of his wife and four children. Their names or ages are not shown in our records, and,

One John K. Osbourne obtained Letters Patent for the Southeast quarter of Section Twenty-six, Township Forty-one, Range Thirteen, West of the Third Meridian at Maymont, Saskatchewan on the 30th of January, 1909. In his sworn statement dated the 16th of November, 1908 in support of his application for Letters Patent for the said land, he gave his age as 56 years and stated that his family consisted of his wife and two children. Their names or ages are not shown in our records.

Our records also disclose that one John Osborne obtained Letters Patent for the Northeast quarter of Section Twenty-two, Township Nine, Range Ten, West of the Principal Meridian in the Province of Manitoba. A copy of your letter has been forwarded to Mr. R.W. Gyles, Director of Lands, Department of Mines and Natural Resources, Winnipeg, Manitoba with a request to forward whatever information he may have concerning Mr. Osborn.


Dear Sir:
